## Important information on handling the catalogue of interdisciplinary electives (ÜWP) at the Faculty of Life Sciences

As of the 2019 summer semester (1 April 2019) the following shall apply:

In the ÜWP, complete modules pursuant to the module descriptions in the associated study and examination regulations must be completed. This means that all courses in a module must be completed; no credit points are awarded for participation in selected, individual courses. If the module description provides for it, ÜWP students must perform special coursework and/or also complete the final module examination, either without a grade (passed/failed) or without the grade being included in the calculation of the final grade.

The specific ÜWP modules on offer can be viewed on Agnes in the course catalogue under "Catalogue of interdisciplinary electives". The content, module courses, any coursework and/or examinations are always based on the latest versions of the respective study and examination regulations of the relevant Faculty.

Credit points are only awarded for fully completed modules pursuant to the applicable study and examination regulations! This applies to the ÜWP as well as to the regular core modules and electives of a degree programme.

Pursuant to § 93 (2) of the General Admission, Study and Examination Regulations of Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin (ZSP-HU), course attendance must not be checked or confirmed (except in internships).

Course attendance can be checked and confirmed by the teachers in individual cases and at the request of the students for individual reasons. "Lecture lists", "appointment lists" or similar are often used for this. Please note that, despite this confirmation of attendance, no credit points are awarded for individual courses at the Faculty of Life Sciences.

Exceptions apply to Erasmus students or students from other exchange programmes and to visiting and auditing students.

## The following remain unaffected by this regulation:

- Transferring credits for participation in governing bodies
- Transferring credits for services by students for students, such as the mentortutor programme (MTP), student project tutorials, Life Sciences Welcome Initiative, etc.

Here credits are transferred as usual.

As a general principle, the available catalogue of interdisciplinary electives is based on the regulations of the relevant Faculty. These can vary significantly at Humboldt-Universität. The Examination Offices receive a great deal of inquiries from confused and/or ill-informed students. These uniform regulations should therefore provide some clarity.
