Dissertation project

1. The doctoral candidate prepares a dissertation with the working title

Supervision of the dissertation project:

7. The doctoral candidate and both supervisors discuss the progress of the thesis on the basis of the exposé, interim reports and individual chapters (frequency, first supervision at least once per semester;

second supervision at least once a year) on the progress of the thesis. The doctoral candidate draws up a brief record of the meetings, which is signed by the supervisors.

² If a cumulative dissertation is planned in accordance with Section 7 (3) of the doctoral degree regulations, this should be included here. Admission to a cumulative doctorate requires the approval of the responsible examination board and the doctoral committee of the Faculty of Arts and Humanities as well as further documents/applications.

8. the first supervisor undertakes to regularly check the preparation of these interim results and the progress of the work as planned and to comment comprehensively - in oral and/or written form - on the contributions delivered at the agreed meeting dates.
9. in addition to the supervisory meetings, the doctoral candidate presents the status of the work once a year in a colloquium and receives feedback on the status and potential for improvement of the dissertation project.
10. both supervisors support the doctoral candidate in his/her publications. In particular, both supervisors will make reasonable efforts to ensure that publications by the doctoral candidate can be placed in reputable journals under subject-specific and justified authorship.

Accompanying training programme:

- 11 The parties agree that the doctoral candidate is obliged to attend specialised events and interdisciplinary qualification events. The scope and content shall be specified in the work plan.
12. in the course of the doctorate, the doctoral candidate shall make his/her own academic contributions (e.g. participation in a conference, submission of a journal article, organisation of a conference, internship or implementation of a course, stays abroad, etc.). These are promptly recorded in the work plan.

Behaviour in cases of conflict:

- 13 In cases of conflict, the parties shall first contact the Examination Board responsible for the subject area or the Faculty's Doctoral Committee. In the event of the dissolution of the supervisory relationship, the examination board responsible for the subject area shall endeavour to find an alternative, appropriate supervisory relationship.
14. the doctoral candidate and both supervisors undertake to comply with the rules of good scientific practice as laid down in the "Statutes of Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin on Safeguarding Good Scientific Practice and Dealing with Allegations of Scientific Misconduct" of 31 March 2023. This includes the doctoral candidate consulting with both supervisors or other persons of trust in cases of doubt. For the supervisors, this expressly means the obligation to respect and name the copyright provisions for texts or findings of the doctoral candidate.
